

Mark's Remarks...



Our God died. Don't think I am spouting the nonsense from the 1960s. In April of 1966, Time Magazine published an article asking if God is dead. It reported on a branch of theology of the 1960s that was trying to write God out of religion. It was an example of the created trying to uncreate their creator. That theology is alive and well today in atheists and agnostics as well as the unreligious.

We know the truth. God is alive and well and in charge. Nothing occurs outside His knowledge. His will is going to triumph in the end. But we are still faced with that statement, "Our God died." It is the message of Good Friday. It was set up on Maundy Thursday. It was being prepared on Palm Sunday and that last week of Jesus' life. Jesus knew for months before this and was trying to prepare His disciples. It was predicted at His nativity (Luke 2:35). What a difficult concept to grasp. Jesus is God. Jesus died.

How much love did our Heavenly Father have for us? He knew from before creation that when He created all things, Jesus would have to die. It's beyond what we can comprehend.

Then we are forced to add more to this: That which was dead, overcame death. Jesus defeated death. By that defeat of death, Jesus shows us His resurrected body and gives us a glimpse of what our resurrected body will be like. How can you contain your joy over this? How can we begin to understand this?

It is easy to overlook all the significance of Holy Week. It is easy to put very little focus on eternal events, cosmic struggles, spiritual battles beyond any that have ever been. It is too easy to make sure the Easter dinner is well planned and not put much thought into all that was done for us. "For God so loved the world" has profound meaning in light of Holy Week. God, thank you that our God died.
