Mark's Remarks...



"For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." "I am the bread of life." John 6:33, 35.

Why is it significant that Jesus is the bread of heaven? Does it really affect us today? Crowds of people came to Jesus after he fed the 5,000. They wanted more food from him. They wanted to witness more miracles. Jesus called them on this desire. He pointed out

to them that it would be better to believe in the one God sent among their midst.

They asked for a sign pointing out that their ancestors ate manna in the wilderness. They were insinuating that Moses gave them that sign, bread from heaven. Jesus points out to them that God is the one who gave their ancestors the bread from heaven. He then states the scripture above: *The bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.*

Jesus is the fulfillment of the manna. Manna miraculously appeared to the Israelites as they wandered in the wilderness. It was bread that gave life, but then only temporarily. The person would hunger again and need to eat more manna. Jesus is the bread that gives life once and for all eternity. We don't need to continue to experience Jesus' work on the cross. Once and for always are we sustained by this bread from heaven.

Each time we take Communion together, we remember what Jesus did for us, once and for always. This Sunday, October 1, is World Communion Sunday. We partake of the elements with Christians all around the world. We remember that Jesus gave his body to be broken on the cross and through the pain of death as payment for our sin.

As you approach the time for Communion this Sunday, spend some time reflecting on the Bread of Heaven. What does it mean for you that Jesus willingly died on the cross? It should fill you with awe. Jesus is truly the Bread of Heaven.

In October, we will be talking about the topic, "Discipleship." We are called to learn from and imitate Jesus. Plan on learning about discipleship during worship in October.




