
Thank you for being you. Thank you God for putting me here with you! Pastor Mark

Where He Leads Us

The new service time is under our belt now. We generally do not like change. But if God is leading us to change, we will hopefully take on the challenge. The Administrative Council is tasked with listening for God's leading. Whatever further changes and calling God places on us, our response will hopefully be: Where He leads us, we will follow. This theme is based on the hymn Where He Leads Me by Ernest W. Blandly. The chorus is:

Where He leads me I will follow. Where He leads me I will follow. Where He leads me I will follow; I'll go with Him, with Him all the way.

It is based on the scripture "If anyone would come after me, he must... take up his cross and follow Me." (Mark 8:34). The future is going to be an adventure for us.

Martha's Coffee House = Fellowship, Hospitality, and Relationships

With the change in our Sunday worship time to one service at 9:30, our Martha's Coffee House hours will also change slightly. At the suggestion of the Worship Team, we plan to have Martha's begin at 9:00 AM, or $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before the service. We will also offer our Martha's fellowship time for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after the service.

As our church family comes back together in one service, we will enjoy seeing our 'old friends' who worshipped at a different time. It will be nice to greet them with "a smile and a wave" in the sanctuary, but it will be even better to have the opportunity to reconnect through conversation as we gather together at Martha's. We will also likely see faces that are new to us. We will be able to meet these folks who by stopping in the library to introduce ourselves. Martha's Coffee House is not just about treats and fellowship. It is about hospitality and building relationships within our church family.

A note to those attending the adult discussion classes at 8:15 AM: You will need to bring your own coffee from home in a travel mug, or visit the Keurig machine in the Fellowship Hall prior to class. After class you will have time to partake in the Martha's treats and fellowship before the 9:30 service begins and/or stay after.

LYFT is our Thursday evening worship service. We start at 5:30 pm with dinner and go right into worship at 6 pm. Worship includes music, a lay speaker or Pastor Mark speaking, prayer and ends with communion. LYFT is a casual worship service where we look forward each week to food, fellowship and fun! Everyone is welcome! Bring a friend!

LYFT gets transformed into Messy Church on the fourth Thursday of each month. Do you know what 'Messy Church' is? We really don't get dirty or messy, it is just another way to say that we are doing church a little differently than normal. We start out as usual with dinner. After dinner, Pastor Mark divides us into 4 groups. The size of the groups depends on how many people are at LYFT that night, but it is usually around 6 per group. There is no communion or speaker on 'Messy Church' night. Try it you might like it!

The four stations that we have at 'Messy Church' are:

1. Dessert station 2. Craft or Mission station 3. Discussion station (with Pastor Mark) 4. Game station

NEWS FROM THE HOUSEHOLD PANTRY

2023...What a year!! The pantry remained open CURBSIDE every month in 2023. We served an average of 53 families each month, with May being our lowest month serving 35 families and March being our highest month serving 62 families. We distributed 635 packed bags in 2023. We were able to supply our families with laundry detergent, dish soap, household cleaner, paper towel, facial tissue, toilet paper, bar soap, deederant, toothpaste/toothpruch, and shampeo/conditioner in a propackaged bag each

toilet paper, bar soap, deodorant, toothpaste/toothbrush, and shampoo/conditioner in a prepackaged bag each month. Feminine hygiene products and diapers were available upon request.

Our total cost for the Household Pantry for 2023 was \$6,162.07. It cost about \$514.00 a month to keep our pantry going. We continued to work in partnership with the Lowell Family Dollar and the St. John Dollar Tree. Please thank Rachel at Family Dollar and Gail at Dollar Tree next time you're there!

Our pantry was blessed with donations from Hawthorne Arbor Gleaner, Indian Trail Grange, Rotary Club, Avery Dennison, Strack's (paper bags), a special couple who donated 6 Aldi Gift cards to 6 families in need, along with many monetary donations within and outside the church. How fortunate the Household Pantry is to be remembered by so many thoughtful people! Thank you from the bottom of my heart!

We head into 2024 with a dedicated staff of compassionate servants whose hearts lie in serving those in our community who need assistance. We are humbled to be able to serve these families. We could not keep this pantry going without tall of you!

Congregational Care Provides Opportunities to Serve Others

Caring Contacts: Three years ago, Covid prevented us from visiting those unable to attend worship. So, we started this "adopt a shut-in" ministry. We reach out to those members living in facilities or confined at home through a card delivered by USPS once a month. We write a few lines to personalize the card and let the person know our church has not forgotten them. Covid is still around, as is the Flu and RSV currently, so this ministry remains a safe way to connect with our shut-ins. Anyone can do this ministry. Just let the office know so we can match you with a shut-in.

Milestone Birthdays: This ministry sends a card that has been signed by the church family to members when they reach a special birthday. We designate 75, 80, 85, 90 & up as 'milestones'. The office provides the data. The cards are set out in the narthex the first Sunday of each month. We are in need of a person to organize and set out the cards once a month and see that they are mailed. Please call the office if you are willing to do this.

Martha's Coffee House: This time of fellowship on Sundays is place to welcome visitors and get to know other members. While Congregational Care provides the coffee and other supplies, we ask for help from the church family to donate a few treats (store bought or homemade) and your time to serve as a host. A signup sheet is available on the serving table in the library each Sunday. A half sheet explaining what a volunteer host does is also available on the table. Please consider asking a friend, or a new person, to join you in taking a turn to host. Hosting does not interfere with attending worship.

Prayer Chain: We keep our church family and others covered in prayer when a crisis or health issue arises. The request for prayer is sent out by email and you simply offer prayer for the person & concern from the privacy of your home. If you want to pray for others in their time of need, contact the office, Kathy Nelson (219-789-5914) or Beth Bales (219-775-0916) to be added to the chain.

Prayer Blankets: We offer handmade lap robes or blankets to those in need of feeling wrapped in God's love. These lap robes and blankets are crocheted, knitted, or made from fleece and donated by members. Donors drop blankets off in the container by the office door. A tag with a message and prayer is added to each blanket, then it is placed in a plastic tub in the library. Blankets may be taken by anyone to a person in need. A sign out sheet is available to avoid duplication. We are in need of a person to keep track of the blanket inventory, add the tags, and oversee the display of blankets in the library. Please let the office know if you are willing to do this.

We want to say THANK YOU to those who have been donating cards for us to send to those who are ill, or have lost a loved one. The donations have been GREAT and have helped keep expenses down for our Caring Cards ministry. There is a blue plastic basket in the library where card donations may be dropped off. As you can see, we have many ministries of caring that provide opportunities for you to serve others. None require attendance at meetings. We welcome the involvement of as many of our church family as possible.


Be careful when you do good work for the church. I'm watching and just waiting to share that gossip.
