### Mark's Remarks...



"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands. One nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

What do these words evoke in you? Perhaps it is a deep patriotism, a reminder of the failings of our nation, a memory of school days. Whatever emotions and thoughts come from these words, they are still powerful words. They were written in 1892 by a pastor. They did not include reference to the U.S.

or to One nation under God. Originally, it stated: "I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." They were written as something children in any nation could say to express pride for where they lived. In 1923 "the flag of the United States of America" was added. Finally, in 1954 President Eisenhower encouraged Congress to add; "under God," to give us the 31 word pledge we use today.

Do you understand the pledge? Do you know what a Republic is? I'll confess that I chose to look it up and make sure I understood it. I happened to be correct, but wasn't confident enough in my answer to share it with others. A Republic is a form of democracy, in which the people elect leaders to represent their interests and make the necessary decisions for the nation. This is the definition of our form of government. Other Republics have some variations to this definition.

We are then pledging that our allegiance to the American flag is in reality to the form of government that is represented by our flag. We desire that nation to continue under God. This means that our nation was established as a Christian nation and we desire to serve and recognize our God in the decisions that are made. We also of course desire God's blessings to continue on our nation.

We state that we are indivisible. We believe that our nation is not to be torn apart. We can't see California and Nevada pull away and still be the United States. We also can't allow Democrats and Republicans to tear our nation apart with bickering. We can't allow blacks and whites; rich and poor; urban and rural or any other possible divisions to fracture our country. We believe that under our flag we can be united, even if we disagree.

We believe that all Americans deserve Liberty and Justice. Liberty is freedom from oppressive government and rule by foreign governments. Justice is the rule of law and penalties we must endure if we break those laws. Liberty and Justice are always in the balance. If you have too much liberty there is anarchy. If there is too much of the rule of law we are stripped of our liberty.

There is much in the Pledge of Allegiance. It is powerful for such a short statement. It is something appropriate for Christians to say. Scripture makes it clear that we are to support the government that is over us. Of course, God must come first. Pray it never comes to a time in the United States that we must choose between the law of the land and God.

Have a happy 4<sup>th</sup> of July and God bless America!

## Mission of the Month

Our July Mission of the Month is Tree of Life Ministries. It is a relief agency, located in Mission, South Dakota on the Rosebud Reservation, serving several of the poorest counties in the United States. The reservation has an 80% unemployment rate. The ministries of Tree of Life include: The Warm Welcome -feeding program and food pantry, Tree of Life Boutique --- thrift store and a construction ministry. Tree of Life distributes over 1,500,000 pounds of groceries each year, and provides about 52,000 free meals. Tree of Life provides a "Thrift Shop Boutique." New and used clothing and small household items are available to buy at a very low cost in a "shopping experience".

On July 13, you will have an opportunity to learn more about our mission, as well as a chance to give. Giving to missions should be above and beyond your giving to the ministries of the church. It is called second-mile giving. Don't feel bad if you don't feel you can afford to support any of these monthly missions.



## **Buddy Bag Food Distribution: Serving Our Community with Love**

Our church is proud to host the weekly Buddy Bag Food Distribution program, partnering with the Community Help Network in Crown Point to serve families in need throughout South Lake County. This wonderful program brings neighbors together in a spirit of hospitality and care, providing essential groceries to those who need them most.

The Community Help Network generously supplies all the food products for this distribution, so our church doesn't need to provide any of the grocery items. Our role is equally important – we provide the welcoming space and volunteer hands that make each distribution a success. Our volunteers greet guests with warmth, help them select items that work best for their families, pack their bags, and assist with carrying groceries to their cars.

In our first week alone, we were able to serve 15 families, many of them with multiple children. It's heartwarming to see the impact this program is already having in our community.

#### **How You Can Help**

While the main food supplies are covered, we do have a couple of specific needs where our church family can make a real difference:

**Fruit donations needed**: We're currently running short on fruit, which can be hard to come by. If you're able to donate canned or fresh fruit, it would be greatly appreciated by our guests.

**Garden surplus welcome**: As the growing season progresses, if you find yourself with extra vegetables from your garden, we'd love to share them with families who visit our distribution. Fresh produce is always a blessing!

Buddy Bag distributions are every Wednesday through August 6<sup>th</sup>. Whether you donate, volunteer, or simply keep this ministry in your prayers, thank you for helping us serve our community with Christ's love.

## **Kids Karnival: A Night of Joy and Community**












#### Vacation Bible School was WILD!
